


FROM OX-WAGON TO AIRPLANE IN NAMIBIA







Modern high-tech has enabled craft that send people into space, yet basic, cost-effective modes of transport such as oxen pulling a simple cart continue to be used in remoter rural areas around the world. Namibia is no exception. While the wooden-wheeled wagons used in traditional ox-wagons a century ago have been replaced by more modern materials, oxen still pull wagons (as well as sand sleds and agricultural implements) in many parts of Namibia.
