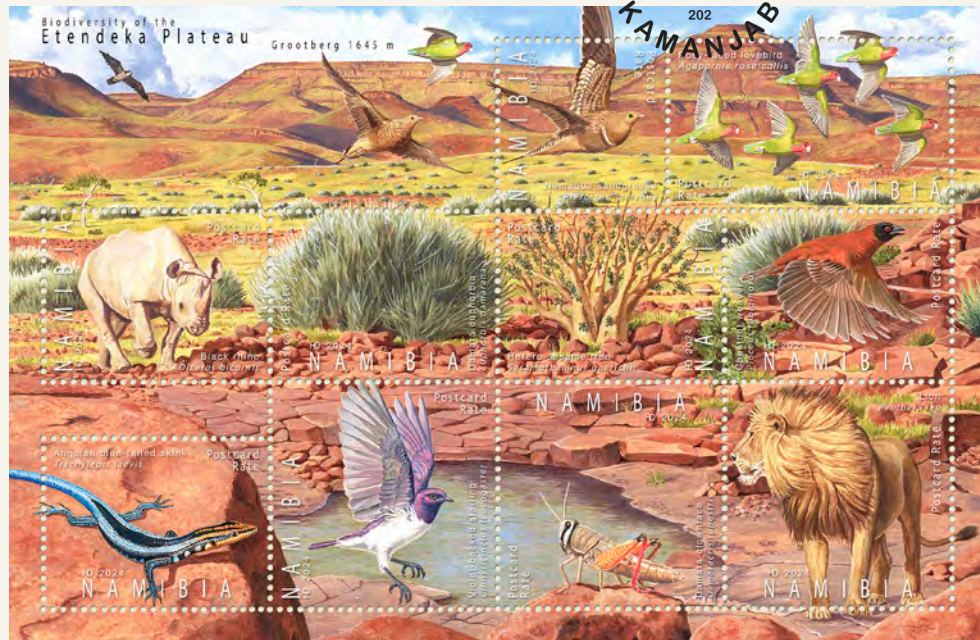

SEA TURTLES OF NAMIBIA

Sea turtles are massive reptiles that spend most of their time in the ocean and only come onto land to lay their eggs.

The young go straight into the ocean soon after hatching, to live their lives at sea. Five species of sea turtle have been recorded in Namibian waters.

MIGRATORY BIRDS OF NAMIBIA

Dozens of species arrive in substantial numbers soon after the first rains, and depart again in late summer.
